#### Dear Fellow Redeemed:

Blessed shall you be in the city, and blessed shall you be in the field. Blessed shall be the fruit of your womb and the fruit of your ground and the fruit of your cattle, the increase of your herds and the young of your flock. Blessed shall be your basket and your kneading bowl. Blessed shall you be when you come in, and blessed shall you be when you go out. (Deuteronomy 28:3-6)

In our family daily Bible Study in which we are reading the Bible chronologically, we read the words above from the book of Deuteronomy a few days ago.

God's people are standing at the border of the Promised Land, ready to go in and take possession of it when God gives His children the promise that serves as our text for this month's devotional. And what does that promise look like? He promises blessing to His people. He will make them prosper, whether they are in the city or the field. He will make the fruit of their work to prosper, whether from the ground or their wombs, their flocks or their herds. He will make them to prosper in all things, whether they are coming in or going out. (In other words, all the time.)

There is however something that He requires of His children. He would do this for Israel only if you obey the voice of the Lord your God. (Deuteronomy 28:2b) If they did that, He promises, all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you. (Deuteronomy 28:2a)

Conversely, if they did not obey the voice of the Lord, if they did not keep the commandments of the Lord and walk in His ways (Deuteronomy 28:9), they would be met with curse and woe. The blessings would be replaced with curses. Everything that the Lord promised to prosper and bless would be cursed and fail.

Thanks be to God that our Lord Jesus Christ has come into our flesh, fulfilled the law for us, died for us, and has been raised from the dead for us and for all people. By His work in our place we have justification before God. We are forgiven, clean, holy, and righteous. The blessing of God is promised to us in Christ Jesus. And one of the greatest things of all, all this depends upon His work and not ours.

All of this is His gift to us in our Baptism, because in Baptism God claims us as His own, makes us His children, His heirs, His holy people. And so it is that the work of our hands and its fruit is holy because we are holy in Christ. It is placed into His service, and thereby it becomes a blessing to us and to our neighbor.

For this great gift, our reception of the blessings of God because of Christ Jesus our Lord, it is our duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him, not to receive more, but because we have already received all that we need. This is most certainly true!







Every month we gather mites. The LWML uses these funds to give grants out to organizations whose focus is to help our neighbors while sharing God's Word ultimately extending God's kingdom. Below are our two recipients highlighted for April:

#### Repairs for St. Paul's Lutheran School, Cullman, AL - \$50,000

St. Paul's Lutheran School has served the church and the Cullman community since 1887, and the current building was built in 1951. St. Paul's is one of two Lutheran elementary schools in northern Alabama. It currently teaches classes pre-K through 6th grade, with the intent to add 7th and 8th grades.

The building has been through multiple tornadoes and there are now safety concerns which need to be addressed, including replacement of windows, emergency doors, and updated heating technology. Because of its location, the school is a mission, reaching unchurched children and their families. Parents are encouraged to attend the daily chapel services and families attend Sunday Divine Service, especially when their child or children sing. This grant would assist in the updating of the heating system and replacement of windows and emergency doors.



We weren't surprised to hear the question, "Do you think it is possible to write our language?" Recording and analyzing a word list is the first step in the process to develop an alphabet, a key tool for Bible Translation. Next month we and a couple colleagues who are linguistic consultants will meet with community representatives from these language groups (plus one more) to work together to begin this exciting step! Another organization is working on Bible translation in these languages and asked for help developing the alphabet.
